'CLAIMS ABOUT DOWNING INDIAN AIRCRAFT MANOHAR KAHANIYAN'**Pak lost F-16s, JF-17s, C-130 on ground & in air: IAF chief**AMRITA NAYAK DUTTA
New Delhi, October 3

IN FIRST PUBLIC remarks detailing Pakistani losses during the hostilities that followed Operation Sindoora, Indian Air Force chief Air Chief Marshal A P Singh said Friday that Indian strikes at three separate locations inside Pakistan resulted in damage to a C-130 aircraft, an Airborne Early Warning and Control (AEW&C) aircraft and "four to five fighter aircraft, most likely F-16s" parked in hangars.

Additionally, an AEW&C aircraft or a Signals Intelligence (SIGINT) aircraft, as well as five advanced fighters of the F-16 and JF-17 class, were taken out in long-range strikes launched by the IAF.

This is the first confirmation of the type of Pakistani aircraft lost in the hostilities. Earlier, on August 9, the IAF chief, while delivering the 16th Air Chief Marshal L M Katre Memorial Lecture in Bengaluru, had only spoken in broad terms, saying "at least five fighters and one large aircraft" were destroyed, without identifying the make of the Pakistani aircraft.

Addressing the media ahead of the 93rd Air Force Day on October 8, Air Chief Marshal Singh said a large number of airfields and installations were struck inside Pakistan.

"Because of these strikes, radars at least four places, command and control centres at two places, runways of course (were) damaged at two places. Then, three of their hangars in three different stations have been damaged," he said.

In those hangars as well as on the tarmac, he said, there were signs that one C-130 aircraft, one AEW&C aircraft and at least four to five fighter aircraft, most likely F-16s, and one SAM system were destroyed.

He said that while these were destroyed on the ground, there was clear evidence of long-range Indian strikes, including one of more than 300 km, destroying either an AEW&C or a SIGINT aircraft, along with five fighters of the F-16 and JF-17 class.

While he did not mention any losses on the Indian side, senior military officers have, in the past, acknowledged that the IAF lost an unspecified number of aircraft during the operation. The government has neither confirmed nor denied these

reports. Responding to Pakistan's claims about Indian losses, the IAF chief said, "Their (Pakistani) narrative is 'Manohar Kahanian'. Let them be happy, after all, they also have to show something to their audience to save their reputation. That doesn't matter to me."

"If they think they shot down 15 of my jets, let them think... I hope they are convinced about it, and they will cater for 15 less aircraft in my inventory when they come to fight again. So why should I talk about it?"

Even today, I won't say anything about what happened, how much damage was done, how it happened, because let them find out... Have you seen a single picture where something fell on any of our air bases, something hit us, a hangar was destroyed, or anything like that? We showed so many pictures of their places," he said.

Asked about plans to procure more S-400 surface-to-air missile systems from Russia in view of its performance during the hostilities with Pakistan, Air Chief Marshal Singh said it performed well and "there's a requirement to have more such" weapon systems. "There is no limit to numbers that you can buy. Again, I am keeping quiet on what the plan is... It has proved to be a good weapon system. We have our own system also developing, so we will take a call on that," he said.

'India will not show restraint next time'PARUL KULSHRESTHA
Jaipur, October 3**GENERAL UPENDRA DWIVEDI**, the Chief of Army Staff, on Friday issued a stern warning to Pakistan, saying that in case of another conflict, India will not exercise the restraint that it showed during "Operation Sindoora 1.0".

During a visit to the border areas of Rajasthan, General Dwivedi urged troops to remain vigilant and united. Speaking in Sriganganagar district, the General warned Pakistan against testing India's resolve and urged it to stop sponsoring terrorism. "Next time, India will not exercise the restraint that India showed during Operation Sindoora 1.0. The action taken will be such that Pakistan will have to consider whether it wants to remain part of the globe," he said.

General Dwivedi also said India presented proof of the destroyed terror camps before the world. "If India hadn't shown the evidence, Pakistan would have hidden it," he said.

In a ceremony, Commandant Prabhakar Singh of the 140th Battalion of the BSF, Major Ritesh Kumar of the Rajputana Rifles, and Havildar Mohit Gera were honoured for the exceptional role they played in Operation Sindoora.

"The fight here is not just the Army's fight – it is the fight of the entire country. The lessons of Sindoora 1.0 have strengthened the resolve of both soldiers and civilians," he said. Quoting Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, he added, "Whenever a woman applies sindoor on her forehead, she remembers the jawan at the frontier. That bond is sacred."

On the targets struck during Operation Sindoora, he said, "We ensured that no innocent lives were lost. Our targets were only terrorist hideouts, training centres, and their masters."

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KARUR STAMPEDE**HC forms SIT, denies bail to TVK leaders**PRESS TRUST OF INDIA

THE MADRAS HIGH Court on Friday formed a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to probe the September 27 stampede at the political rally of actor and TVK founder Vijay, on a day when two senior party leaders' anticipatory bail petitions were rejected by the high court which also found fault with the party and the police over the incident that killed 41 persons and injured many as 41 persons.

The high court formed the SIT under senior IPS officer and Inspector General, North Zone, Asra Garg, to probe the matter. It also criticised the TVK organisers of the event, the party leadership and the police over the stampede, which killed children, among others.

The Madurai bench dismissed the anticipatory bail pleas of Tamilaga Vettai Kazhagam (TVK) state general secretary Bussy N Anand and deputy general secretary CTR Nirmal Kumar, who have been named in the FIR in connection with the incident.

FROM VACCINES TO MOVIES AND NOW A DOSE OF SPORTS, ADAR POONAWALLA IS MOST INDUSTRIOUS WHEN OPPORTUNITY BECKONS

ALOKANANDA CHAKRABORTY**HE CERTAINLY DOESN'T** complain about the noise when opportunity knocks.

Serum Institute CEO Adar Poonawalla wedged his way back into the spotlight this week with a carefully-worded, single-sentence tweet: "At the right valuation, @RCBTweets is a great team".

By all accounts, Poonawalla is the front-runner to snap up IPL team and 2025 season winner Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) from the team's current owner United Spirits, a subsidiary of global beverage giant Diageo.

The 44-year-old University of Westminster, London, graduate, has an impeccable record of placing great bets.

In 2020, after the world had gone through a whole year of the Covid-19 pandemic and lockdowns and social distancing were de rigueur, the Serum Institute of India (SII) partnered with the British-Swedish pharmaceutical company AstraZeneca and the University of Oxford to manufacture the Covid-19 vaccine originally designated AZD1222 and popularly known as Covishield. It was a calculated risk -- SII began to manufacture the vaccine before clinical trials were fully completed. The decision ensured a faster rollout if the trials proved successful.

If they didn't, it also meant that SII would be sitting on a stockpile of dud products -- and billions in losses. But Poonawalla didn't think twice. In a 2021 interview he said it was an easy decision -- one he made in consultation with his then 78-year-old

father, Cyrus. "Because we're privately listed and not accountable to investors and bankers and shareholders, it was just a quick five-minute chat between myself and my father," he had said.

When the coronavirus struck, which happens to be the world's largest vaccine-producing company in the world's largest vaccine-producing nation -- was already manufacturing vaccines for measles, tetanus, diphtheria, hepatitis and many other diseases. The firm specialises in generic versions, exports to close to 200 countries and estimates that about two-thirds of the world's children are inoculated with its vaccines.

Poonawalla's 2020 gamble paid off handsomely. SII's revenue shot up from ₹5,446 crore in fiscal year (FY) 2020 to ₹25,645 crore in FY22, a nearly fivefold jump. Profits skyrocketed -- they rose from ₹2,251 crore in FY20 to ₹11,116 crore in FY22.

And Adar Poonawalla became the poster child of India's fight

against the Covid-19 pandemic.

As expected, that market vanished in two years. In FY24, SII's revenue slumped to ₹9,549 and profits to ₹4,278 crore.

Though the numbers were still better than those posted in the pre-pandemic years, they spurred Poonawalla to diversify -- from launching a bunch of fresh vaccines and refocusing on its pre-Covid pipeline of malaria, HPV etc, to venturing into unrelated categories like finance and film production.

In May 2021, Poonawalla's Rising Sun Holdings acquired a controlling 60% stake in Magma Fincorp, which was incorporated in 1978, for close to ₹3,500 crore. The company was then rebranded

Poonawalla Fincorp, marking its entry into the non-banking finance sector.

In two years, he was ready to double his investment in Biocion Biologics committing \$150 million, bringing his total investment to \$300 million.

Then in 2024,

Poonawalla picked up a 50% stake in film maker Karan Johar's production company Dharma Productions and its digital arm Dharmatic Entertainment for about ₹1,000 crore. Poonawalla said he didn't expect significant revenue from films, it was more of a "passion-driven" move. He had known Karan Johar and his team for years and the goal was to tell powerful stories -- like *Kesari* 2 on the Jallianwala Bagh massacre -- and build distribution and intellectual property over time.

A key focus area in his vaccine play is also to build SII's own IP and reduce dependence on partnerships. Owning the technology gives the firm more control and further its sustainability goals, he has said.

SII is currently working on vaccines for mosquito-borne diseases -- dengue, yellow fever, chikungunya. These will be rolled out over the next two to three years. SII is also looking to expand into Europe and the US, markets that it hadn't traditionally served.

If accolades are a barometer for achievement, Adar Poonawalla has little to complain about. He has bagged many plaudits over the years, most recently being Fortune's Greatest Leaders (2021). He was the winner of the Forbes India Leadership Award for GenNext Entrepreneur and and CNBC Asia's award for Corporate Social Responsibility (both in 2018), and was appointed Indian of the Year -- CSR Category (2020). He also has Economic Times Entrepreneur of the Year (2021), Hurun National Icon of Philanthropy (2019) awards in his bag.

IN FIRST PUBLIC remarks detailing Pakistani losses during the hostilities that followed Operation Sindoar, Indian Air Force chief Air Chief Marshal A P Singh said Friday that Indian strikes at three separate locations inside Pakistan resulted in damage to a C-130 aircraft, an Airborne Early Warning and Control (AEW&C) aircraft and "four to five fighter aircraft, most likely F-16s" parked in hangars.

Additionally, an AEW&C aircraft or a Signals Intelligence (SIGINT) aircraft, as well as five advanced fighters of the F-16 and JF-17 class, were taken out in long-range strikes launched by the IAF.

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Addressing the media ahead of the 93rd Air Force Day on October 8, Air Chief Marshal Singh said a large number of airfields and installations were struck inside Pakistan.

"Because of these strikes, radars at least four places, command and control centres at two places, runways of course (were) damaged at two places. Then, three of their hangars in three different stations have been damaged," he said.

In those hangars as well as on the tarmac, he said, there were signs that one C-130 aircraft, one AEW&C aircraft and at least four to five fighter aircraft, most likely F-16s, and one SAM system were destroyed.

He said that while these were destroyed on the ground, there was clear evidence of long-range Indian strikes, including one of more than 300 km, destroying either an AEW&C or a SIGINT aircraft, along with five fighters of the F-16 and JF-17 class.

While he did not mention any losses on the Indian side, senior military officers have, in the past, acknowledged that the IAF lost an unspecified number of aircraft during the operation. The government has neither confirmed nor denied these

reports. Responding to Pakistan's claims about Indian losses, the IAF chief said, "Their (Pakistani) narrative is 'Manohar Kahaniyan'. Let them be happy, after all, they also have to show something to their audience to save their reputation. That doesn't matter to me."

"If they think they shot down 15 of my jets, let them think... I hope they are convinced about it, and they will cater for 15 less aircraft in my inventory when they come to fight again. So why should I talk about it?"

"Even today, I won't say anything about what happened, how much damage was done, how it happened, because let them find out... Have you seen a single picture where something fell on any of our air bases, something hit us, a hangar was destroyed, or anything like that? We showed so many pictures of their places," he said.

Asked about plans to procure more S-400 surface-to-air missile systems from Russia in view of its performance during the hostilities with Pakistan, Air Chief Marshal Singh said it performed well and "there's a requirement to have more such" weapon systems. "There is no limit to numbers that you can buy. Again, I am keeping quiet on what the plan is... It has proved to be a good weapon system. We have our own system also developing, so we will take a call on that," he said.

GENERAL UPENDRA DWIVEDI, the Chief of Army Staff, on Friday issued a stern warning to Pakistan, saying that in case of another conflict, India will not exercise the restraint that it showed during "Operation Sindoar 1.0".

During a visit to the border areas of Rajasthan, General Dwivedi urged troops to remain vigilant and united.

Speaking in Sriganganagar district, the General warned Pakistan against testing India's resolve and urged it to stop sponsoring terrorism. "Next time, India will not exercise the restraint that India showed during Operation Sindoar 1.0. The action taken will be such that Pakistan will have to consider whether it wants to remain part of the globe," he said.

He said that Operation Sindoar, in which India struck terrorist sites inside Pakistan in the aftermath of the April 22 Pathalgam terror attack, had left a lasting impact on the nation.

"The fight here is not just the Army's fight – it is the fight of the entire country. The lessons of Sindoar 1.0 have strengthened the resolve of both soldiers and civilians," he said. Quoting Defence Minister Rajnath Singh, he added, "Whenever a woman applies sindoor on her forehead, she remembers the jawan at the frontier. That bond is sacred."

On the targets struck during Operation Sindoar, he said, "We ensured that no innocent lives were lost. Our targets were only terrorist hideouts, training centres, and their masters."

General Dwivedi also said India presented proof of the destroyed terror camps before the world. "If India hadn't shown the evidence, Pakistan would have hidden it," he said.

In a ceremony, Commandant Prabhakar Singh of the 140th Battalion of the BSF, Major Ritesh Kumar of the Rajputana Rifles, and Havildar Mohit Gera were honoured for the exceptional role they played in Operation Sindoar.

All in a day's work

FROM VACCINES TO MOVIES AND NOW A DOSE OF SPORTS, ADAR POONAWALLA IS MOST INDUSTRIOUS WHEN OPPORTUNITY BECKONS

HE CERTAINLY DOESN'T complain about the noise when opportunity knocks.

Serum Institute CEO Adar Poonawalla wedged his way back into the spotlight this week with a carefully-worded, single-sentence tweet: "At the right valuation, @RCBTweets is a great team".

By all accounts, Poonawalla is the front-runner to snap up IPL team and 2025 season winner Royal Challengers Bengaluru (RCB) from the team's current owner United Spirits, a subsidiary of global beverage giant Diageo.

The 44-year-old University of Westminster, London, graduate, has an impeccable record of placing great bets.

In 2020, after the world had gone through a whole year of the Covid-19 pandemic and lockdowns and social distancing were de rigueur, Serum Institute of India (SII) partnered with the British-Swedish pharmaceutical company AstraZeneca and the University of Oxford to manufacture the Covid-19 vaccine originally designated AZD1222 and popularly known as Covishield. It was a calculated risk – SII began to manufacture the vaccine before clinical trials were fully completed. The decision ensured a faster rollout if the trials proved successful.

If they didn't, it also meant that SII would be sitting on a stockpile of dud products – and billions in losses.

But Poonawalla didn't think twice. In a 2021 interview he said it was an easy decision – one he made in consultation with his then 78-year-old

father, Cyrus. "Because we're privately listed and not accountable to investors and bankers and shareholders, it was just a quick five-minute chat between myself and my father," he had said.

When the coronavirus struck, which happens to be the

world's largest vaccine-producing company in the world's largest vaccine-producing nation – was already manufacturing vaccines for measles, tetanus, diphtheria, hepatitis and many other diseases. The firm specialises in generic versions, exports to close to 200 countries and estimates that about two-thirds of the world's children are inoculated with its vaccines.

Poonawalla's 2020 gamble paid off handsomely. SII's revenue shot up from ₹5,446 crore in fiscal year (FY) 2020 to ₹25,645 crore in FY22, a nearly fivefold jump. Profits skyrocketed – they rose from ₹2,251 crore in FY20 to ₹11,116 crore in FY22.

And Adar Poonawalla became the poster child of India's fight

against the Covid-19 pandemic.

As expected, that market vanished in two years. In FY24, SII's revenue slumped to ₹9,549 and profits to ₹4,278 crore.

Though the numbers were still better than those posted in the pre-pandemic years, they spurred Poonawalla to diversify – from launching a bunch of fresh vaccines and refocusing on its pre-Covid pipeline of malaria, HPV etc., to venturing into unrelated categories like finance and film production.

In May 2021, Poonawalla's Rising Sun Holdings acquired a controlling 60% stake in Magma Fincorp, which was incorporated in 1978, for close to ₹3,500 crore. The company was then rebranded

Poonawalla Fincorp, marking its entry into the non-banking finance sector.

In two years, he was ready to double his investment in Biocion Biologics committing \$150 million, bringing his total investment to \$300 million.

Then in 2024,

Poonawalla picked up a 50% stake in film maker Karan Johar's production company Dharma Productions and its digital arm Dharmatic Entertainment for about ₹1,000 crore. Poonawalla said he didn't expect significant revenue from films, it was more of a "passion-driven" move. He had known Karan Johar and his team for years and the goal was to tell powerful stories – like *Kesari* 2 on the Jallianwala Bagh massacre – and build distribution and intellectual property over time.

A key focus area in his vaccine play is also to build SII's own IP and reduce dependence on partnerships. Own the technology gives the firm more control and further its sustainability goals, he has said.

SII is currently working on vaccines for mosquito-borne diseases – dengue, yellow fever, chikungunya. These will be rolled out over the next two to three years. SII is also looking to expand into Europe and the US, markets that it hadn't traditionally served.

HC forms SIT, denies bail to TVK leaders

Pak lost F-16s, JF-17s, C-130 on ground & in air: IAF chief

IN FIRST PUBLIC remarks detailing Pakistani losses during the hostilities that followed Operation Sindoora, Indian Air Force chief Air Chief Marshal A P Singh said Friday that Indian strikes at three separate locations inside Pakistan resulted in damage to a C-130 aircraft, an Airborne Early Warning and Control (AEW&C) aircraft and "four to five fighter aircraft, most likely F-16s" parked in hangars.

Additionally, an AEW&C aircraft or a Signals Intelligence (SIGINT) aircraft, as well as five advanced fighters of the F-16 and JF-17 class, were taken out in long-range strikes launched by the IAF.

This is the first confirmation of the type of Pakistani aircraft lost in the hostilities. Earlier, on August 9, the IAF chief, while delivering the 16th Air Chief Marshal L M Katre Memorial Lecture in Bengaluru, had only spoken in broad terms, saying, "at least five fighters and one large aircraft" were destroyed, without identifying the make of the Pakistani aircraft.

Addressing the media ahead of the 93rd Air Force Day on October 8, Air Chief Marshal Singh said a large number of airfields and installations were struck inside Pakistan.

"Because of these strikes, radars at least four places, command and control centres at two places, runways of course (were) damaged at two places. Then, three of their hangars in three different stations have been damaged," he said.

In those hangars as well as on the tarmac, he said, there were signs that one C-130 aircraft, one AEW&C aircraft and at least four to five fighter aircraft, most likely F-16s, and one SAM system were destroyed.

He said that while these were destroyed on the ground, there was clear evidence of long-range Indian strikes, including one of more than 300 km, destroying either an AEW&C or a SIGINT aircraft, along with five fighters of the F-16 and JF-17 class.

While he did not mention any losses on the Indian side, senior military officers have, in the past, acknowledged that the IAF lost an unspecified number of aircraft during the operation. The government has neither confirmed nor denied these

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All in a day's work

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If they didn't, it also meant that SII would be sitting on a stockpile of dud products – and billions in losses.

But Poonawalla didn't think twice. In a 2021 interview he said it was an easy decision – one he made in consultation with his then 78-year-old

father, Cyrus. "Because we're privately listed and not accountable to investors and bankers and shareholders, it was just a quick five-minute chat between myself and my father," he had said.

When the coronavirus struck, which happens to be the world's largest vaccine-producing company in the world's largest vaccine-producing nation – was already manufacturing vaccines for measles, tetanus, diphtheria, hepatitis and many other diseases. The firm specialises in generic versions, exports to close to 200 countries and estimates that about two-thirds of the world's children are inoculated with its vaccines.

Poonawalla's 2020 gamble paid off handsomely. SII's revenue shot up from ₹5,446 crore in fiscal year (FY) 2020 to ₹25,645 crore in FY22, a nearly fivefold jump. Profits skyrocketed – they rose from ₹2,251 crore in FY20 to ₹11,116 crore in FY22.

And Adar Poonawalla became the poster child of India's fight

against the Covid-19 pandemic.

As expected, that market vanished in two years. In FY24, SII's revenue slumped to ₹9,549 and profits to ₹4,278 crore.

Though the numbers were still better than those posted in the pre-pandemic years, they spurred Poonawalla to diversify – from launching a bunch of fresh vaccines and refocusing on its pre-Covid pipeline of malaria, HPV etc, to venturing into unrelated categories like finance and film production.

In May 2021, Poonawalla's Rising Sun Holdings acquired a controlling 60% stake in Magma Fincorp, which was incorporated in 1978, for close to ₹3,500 crore. The company was then rebranded

Poonawalla Fincorp, marking its entry into the non-banking finance sector.

In two years, he was ready to double his investment in Biocion Biologics committing \$150 million, bringing his total investment to \$300 million.

Then in 2024,

Poonawalla picked up a 50% stake in film maker Karan Johar's production company Dharma Productions and its digital arm Dharmatic Entertainment for about ₹1,000 crore. Poonawalla said he didn't expect significant revenue from films, it was more of a "passion-driven" move. He had known Karan Johar and his team for years and the goal was to tell powerful stories – like *Kesari* 2 on the Jallianwala Bagh massacre – and build distribution and intellectual property over time.

A key focus area in his vaccine play is also to build SII's own IP and reduce dependence on partnerships. Own the technology gives the firm more control and further its sustainability goals, he has said.

SII is currently working on vaccines for mosquito-borne diseases – dengue, yellow fever, chikungunya. These will be rolled out over the next two to three years. SII is also looking to expand into Europe and the US, markets that it hadn't traditionally served.

If accolades are a barometer for achievement, Adar Poonawalla has little to complain about. He has bagged many plaudits over the years, most recently being Fortune's Greatest Leaders (2021). He was the winner of the Forbes India Leadership Award for GenNext Entrepreneur and and CNBC Asia's award for Corporate Social Responsibility (both in 2018), and was appointed Indian of the Year – CSR Category (2020). He also has Economic Times Entrepreneur of the Year (2021), Hurun National Icon of Philanthropy (2019) awards in his bag.

Ladakh left four people dead and 90 injured in the Union territory. He is lodged in Jodhpur jail in Rajasthan. Angmo, in her plea, has also questioned the decision to invoke the NSA against Wangchuk.

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In those hangars as well as on the tarmac, he said, there were signs that one C-130 aircraft, one AEW&C aircraft and at least four to five fighter aircraft, most likely F-16s, and one SAM system were destroyed.

He said that while these were destroyed on the ground, there was clear evidence of long-range Indian strikes, including one of more than 300 km, destroying either an AEW&C or a SIGINT aircraft, along with five fighters of the F-16 and JF-17 class.

While he did not mention any losses on the Indian side, senior military officers have, in the past, acknowledged that the IAF lost an unspecified number of aircraft during the operation. The government has neither confirmed nor denied these

reports. Responding to Pakistan's claims about Indian losses, the IAF chief said, "Their (Pakistani) narrative is 'Manohar Kahanian'. Let them be happy, after all, they also have to show something to their audience to save their reputation. That doesn't matter to me."

"If they think they shot down 15 of my jets, let them think... I hope they are convinced about it, and they will cater for 15 less aircraft in my inventory when they come to fight again. So why should I talk about it?"

Even today, I won't say anything about what happened, how much damage was done, how it happened, because let them find out... Have you seen a single picture where something fell on any of our air bases, something hit us, a hangar was destroyed, or anything like that? We showed so many pictures of their places," he said.

Asked about plans to procure more S-400 surface-to-air missile systems from Russia in view of its performance during the hostilities with Pakistan, Air Chief Marshal Singh said it performed well and "there's a requirement to have more such" weapon systems. "There is no limit to numbers that you can buy. Again, I am keeping quiet on what the plan is... It has proved to be a good weapon system. We have our own system also developing, so we will take a call on that," he said.

IN FIRST PUBLIC remarks detailing Pakistani losses during the hostilities that followed Operation Sindoar, Indian Air Force chief Air Chief Marshal A P Singh said Friday that Indian strikes at three separate locations inside Pakistan resulted in damage to a C-130 aircraft, an Airborne Early Warning and Control (AEW&C) aircraft and "four to five fighter aircraft, most likely F-16s" parked in hangars.

Additionally, an AEW&C aircraft or a Signals Intelligence (SIGINT) aircraft, as well as five advanced fighters of the F-16 and JF-17 class, were taken out in long-range strikes launched by the IAF.

This is the first confirmation of the type of Pakistani aircraft lost in the hostilities. Earlier, on August 9, the IAF chief, while delivering the 16th Air Chief Marshal L M Katra Memorial Lecture in Bengaluru, had only spoken in broad terms, saying "at least five fighters and one large aircraft" were destroyed, without identifying the make of the Pakistani aircraft.

Addressing the media ahead of the 93rd Air Force Day on October 8, Air Chief Marshal Singh said a large number of airfields and installations were struck inside Pakistan.

"Because of these strikes, radars at least four places, command and control centres at two places, runways of course (were) damaged at two places. Then, three of their hangars in three different stations have been damaged," he said.
